#### Goal

Chicago recognized nationally as a model for municipal operations

Targets 30% improvement in effectiveness of all services targeted

1-2 years

\$1 million improvement in bottom line efficiency of all areas targeted

#### Accomplishments


- Created Advisory Council of senior business leaders for Chicago Performance Management (CPM)
- Rolled out new IT system for CPM
- Launched initiative to make CPM known publicly
- Developed scorecards and management processes for City-wide, interdepartmental priorities
- Reduced inspection processing times for gang houses from 128 to 8 days
- Expedited implementation of two low income housing projects by > 6 months each
- Reduced wait time for taxi inspections by 50 min per taxi, saving ~ 13,000 hours per year
- Improved productivity of building inspectors by ~ 40%
- Developed plan to consolidate >2mm ft2 of office space and organization to manage of \$1 billion RE portfolio
- Instituted new performance management system at Chicago Transit Authority
